PROGRAM OVERVIEW

“Clean It Up, Tear It Down: D&D Project Learnings!”

Chuck Denham will present an illustrated Power Point show of the lessons learned during decontamination and dismantlement of abandoned chemical manufacturing units at a major chemical manufacturing facility. Chuck was the Technical Manager for a five year, \$26 million program to clean up and remove obsolete chemical manufacturing facilities on a 75 year-old site. This slide show was put together by the project team leaders to train others in effectively managing these type projects.

Charles J. (Chuck) Denham and his wife, Shirley, live in Kanawha City. Chuck has a BS in Chemical Engineering from Northwestern University, and a Masters in Engineering Management and Environmental Engineering from Marshall University. He is a registered Professional Engineer in WV and currently does part time consulting with his company, Engineering Management, PLLC, after retiring from E. I. DuPont, Belle Works, in 2001.
